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College Profile

Budhal is located at a distance of 60km in the East of District Headquater Rajouri, at the distance of 120km at the west of District Reasi Headquater and 89km from the state summer capital Srinagar. The climate of this place is very charming from moderate to cool. The average temperature range is 5°to 25°c.

Govt. Degree College Budhal was established in May 2008 under Prime Minister Reconstruction programme with seven subjects namely English, Political Science, History, Urdu, Persian, Hindi and Education. In 2009-10 one more subject EVS was added. In 2010-11 three subjects namely Mathematics, Arabic and Sociology were started. From the session 2015-16 one more subject Computer Application was also started. From the academic session 2017-18 CBCS was introduced in the college.

<u>Note:-</u> The fee structure detailed above is subject to change/revision as per the orders of the Govt. & the university of Jammu which may be communicated to the College authorities from time to time. The exact fee to be deposited at the time of admission shall be displayed for the convenience of students seeking admission in the college.

Admission Procedures

- 1. The date of admission to B.A Sem-I, Sem-III & Sem-vth classes in the college shall be notified in accordance with the directive issued by the University of Jammu.
- 2. Students seeking admission in B.A. Sem-I, Sem-III & Sem-vth shall have to apply on printed application form along-with prospectus available in the college.

Admission Rules

- 1. A candidate who has passed Higher Secondary Part-II Examination through JKBOSE or an examination recognized as its equivalent by the University of Jammu is only eligible for admission to B.A. Sem-I
- 2. Admission is open to all state subject holders and children of Central Government employees, Army and Para-Military personnel posted in J&K State.
- 3. A candidate with a break in academic year will not be considered for admission in the college. However, Principal may allow gap cases subject to the availability of seats where he gets fully convinced by the time gap justifying reasons.
- 4. A student whose result is declared late by the Board/University may be admitted as per admission rules of the University Subject to the availability of seats.
- 5. All the students seeking admission shall have to be present themselves personally, alongwith their parents/guardians.
- 6. Admission to various classes starts on the dates notified by University of Jammu.
- 7. Candidates from other institution will not be admitted other than the exceptional cases (Not Applicable for Semester-I)
- 8. All drop out cases, absentees, re-appear and failures candidates shall not be admitted in any cases.

Cancellation of Admission

- 1. If a student remains absent continuously for 15 days without any genuine reasons/and information, his/her name shall be struck off from the College Roll and he/she will not be re-admitted under any circumstances.
- 2. Any student found indulging in any undesirable activity in the College shall be dealt under rules to the extent of rustication from the college.

Documents to be attached

Student seeking admission in the college should present himself/herself personally at the time of admission along with parents and produce the following documents:-

- 1. Self-attested copies of matriculation certificate indicating DOB (4 copies).
- 2. Marks certificates of the last class passed (5 self-attested copies).
- 3. Provisional/transfer certificate (in original issued by the institution last attended).
- 4. 6 recent passport size photographs.
- 5. Character certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last attended (in case of regular candidates) and in the case of private candidate, the character certificate should be signed by a 1st class magistrate/SDPO/SHO of the area concerned.
- 4 self-attested photocopies of reserve category certificate from the competent authority as stated in SRO-126, Dated 28-06-1994.
- 7. Affidavit as per the requirement.

Note:- Candidates are required to bring all original documents for verification purpose at the time of admission.

Scheme of Examination / Assessment under CBCS

The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts: Internal or in semester assessment(IA) and External or End- Semester Assessment(EA). The Internal grade awarded to the students in each course in a semester shall be published on the notice board at least one week before the commencement of end Semester Examination. The responsibility of evaluating the internal assessment is vested on the Teacher who teaches the course. There will be University Examination at the end of each Semester for both theory and practical. Semester end examinations for all theory papers shall be got prepared by the Controller of Examination as per existing norms.

The evaluation of the candidate shall be awarded and record thereof maintain in accordance with the Regulations prescribed for the purpose under the CBCS as per following:

Minimum Eligibility For appearance In Examination

A semester end external examination for B.A course, under CBCS, shall be open to the following categories of students:-

- 1. A regular student i.e a student who has undergone a regular course of study in a college for the period specified for that course of study by having been on the rolls of the college immediately preceding the examination & has his/her name submitted to the controller of examinations by the college Principal where he/she has pursued the course for the examination & fulfill the following conditions to be certified by the college Principal concerned:-
- He/she has been a student of good conduct.
- He/she has attended not less than 75% of the lecture delivered including seminars, tutorials etc in each course opted by him/her in that semester.
- He/she has passed in internal assessment.
- In the case of lab. Course/practicals, he/she has attended not less than 75% of the practical classes conducted.
- He/she has paid the prescribed fee.
- 2. Ex-students i.e students who after having undergone a regular course of study & having completed all conditions of eligibility for appearance in a course in a semester examination including minimum attendance requirement & having passed in internal assessment & having either failed to pass the semester examination in that subject/paper or been unable to appear in the examination in that subject/paper will be eligible to appear as a private candidate in the examination by submitting his/her application on the prescribed form along with prescribed fees to reach the controller of examinations within the dates fixed for this purpose.

Promotion to next Semester

- 1. A student will be eligible for promotion from sem 1st to 2nd, sem 3rd to 4th if he/she has:-
- a) Secured pass marks in internal assessment of all the subjects/papers of the semester I/II as the case may be.
- b) Has appeared in at least one of the papers of Semester End Examination of semester I/II as the case may be.
- 2. A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-II to III and semester-IV to V provided he/she has earned at 50% of the total credits for the subjects/papers of theory/practical of Semester-I/III as the case may be had passed in Internal Assessment of all subjects/papers of Semester II/Iv as the case may be.

- 3. Students will be eligible for promotion from Semester-V to VI provided he/she has passed in all subjects/papers semester-I and Semester-III. Provided that a student who does not fulfill the promotion criteria (1),(2) &(3) above shall be declared fail in semester concerned. However, he/she shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which he/she has secured Pass marks.
- 4. A student who has to reappear in a subject/paper prescribed for semester-I to IV shall appear in the subsequent Semester end examination to be held as per the dates prescribed by the University of Jammu.
- 5. A student who has to reappear in a subject(s)/paper(s) prescribed for semester-V &VI shall appear in the supplementary examination.

Condonation of Lectures

- 1. The Principal of College concerned may condone shortage of a student in attendance in a semester for special reasons, to be recorded in writing upto 6% of the lectures delivered or practical's conducted in each course separately.
- 2. Any candidate, who falls short of attendance beyond condonable limits or whose shortage in attendance is not condoned by the competent authorities and wants to pursue the programme, shall be required to rejoin the course along with the next batch of students of the same class to make up the deficiency by attending the required number of lectures by which he/she had fallen short. This provison shall however, be applicable only in respect of such of the candidate who attended at least 50% classes in the said course/s. candidate having attended less than 50% of the lectures in a particulars course/s shall be considered for readmission after depositing afresh the prescribed admission fee for the Semester/course. However, such candidates shall appear in the examination along with the candidates of the Semester, with which he/she has been readmitted, in regular capacity.

Provided further also that in case such a student again falls short of lectures he/she shall not be allowed to seek admission to that course in any affiliated college in any subsequent year.

A student who has been on the rolls of a college of a sem I,II,III,IV & V of B.A course & earns eligibility to join the semester-II/III/IV/V of the programme as the case may be, but fails to join the semester when he/she was due to join it or discontinues his/her studies for any reason whatsoever may be considered for admission to the semester concerned in a subsequent year if he/she submits application to this effect before the commencement of the semester concerned provided a seat & other facilities for the courses offered by the student are available in the college concerned in the semester, he/she wishes to join & the student seeks admission within a period of one year from the date he/she discontinue his/her studies.

Passing Criterion

The minimum grade/grade point required to pass each paper in a semester examination under CBCS shall be Grade D/Grade Point 4 in each theory paper/practical/project (wherever applicable) in External Examination and Internal assessment separately.

Determination of Grades

Absolute grading would be used where the marks obtained are converted to grades based on predetermined class intervals. To implement the following grading system, the colleges/campuses shall use the following UGC recommended 10 point grading system:-

Computation of SGPA & CGPA

The following procedure shall be uses to compute the SGPA &CGPA:-

- 1. The SGPA is a ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the Grade Points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e. SGPA (Si)= \sum (Ci x Gi)/ \sum Ci, where Ci is a number of credits of the ith course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the ith course.
- 2. The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e. $CGPA = \sum (Ci \times Si)/\sum Ci$ where Si is the SGPA of the ith semester Ci is the total number of credits in that semester.
- 3. The SGPA & CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points & reported in the transcripts.

Re-evaluation of Answer Scripts

- 1. Re-evaluation of answer scripts of semester end external examination shall be permissible in each course of a semester examination of B.A as per the university rules.
- 2. Re-evaluation shall not be permitted in the practical, internal assessment, project report, dissertation, thesis & viva-voce etc.
- 3. Re-evaluation shall not be permissible for candidates connected with improvement of grades.

- 1. The college has well equipped laboratory for Computer Application.
- 2. The college has Bus facility for the students residing in Kewal, Phalni, Samote & Bakori.
- 3. Various scholarships are granted to meritorious, deserving & poor students.
- 4. The college has a well furnished library with thousands of books of various subjects.
- a) Books are issued for a period of 14 days only & a fine of Rupees 5 per day shall be charged after the due date.
- b) Students can borrow a maximum of 2 books from the library at a time.
- c) Strict silence shall be observed in the library & reading rooms.
- 5. Educational & subject tours & picnics are also organized from time to time.
- 6. The college has a big playground where games like cricket, volleyball, kabaddi, football etc. are played regularly. Besides indoor games playing facility is also available.
- 7. National Service Scheme (NSS):- To foster a spirit of comradeship of love for humanity in general and rural folk in particular, facilities are provided to willing workers with desire for social service, to put in the best for alleviating the suffering of the sick, unfortunate & downtrodden.
- **8. MANUU** has established a study center no. 120 in the college. It offers UG programme like BA.

f* General Rules

- 1. No outsider is allowed to enter the college without a valid reason.
